The events of the First World War brought to an end a continuous presence of Germans in India dating back at least as far as Ziegenhals. The ethnic cleansing which took place appears almost total. According to one official document from March 1920, only 62 Germans avoided repatriation, made up of 40 men, 17 women and six children, although even these would have sailed home on the *Patriotic*. Over 3,200 Germans and Austrians had "recently been repatriated".

Those who wished to return in the immediate aftermath of the War received no sympathy from the Government of India; no matter how long they may have resided in the country. They included Franz von Berchthold, born in Germany in 1877 and taking up residence in India in 1891 where he would remain until 1914 - with the exception of spells in the USA and Western Australia. He had established a business in Agra but faced internment, had his concerns liquidated and experienced repatriation to Europe on board the *Patriotic*. Absent from India when the War broke out, he decided to return on the advice of an Indian
